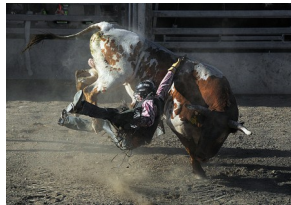

Still images or action shots, they all should be able to convey to the viewer a story of what is happening. The image titled Mayhem illustrates this very well, even without the title you can see that the vehicles are all over the place. The title just describes the action nicely.

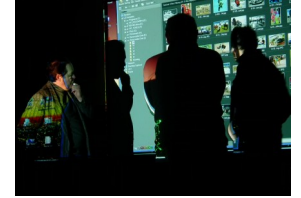
Look at the other images, take the titles away and see how you interpret what you see in the image.

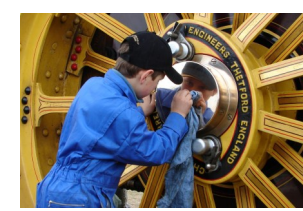
