### Editor's note:

The above help sheet was prepared by John Stewart LPSNZ for the club's recent field trip to the New Brighton Pier for night photography.

### New Brighton Photographic Club

Night time pier photography (help sheet)

### Requirements:

- Camera and lens (wide angle to standard)
- Tripod
- Cable/electronic release
- Small torch
- Warm clothes

If there is any wind try not to do any lens changes on the beach. Decide on lens to use before leaving car.

If you have a digital SLR that has mirror lock, enable mirror lock.

With a camera on a tripod disable image stabilisation (IS/VR) if your system has this.

Select an ISO around 200 – 400 and white balance can be fluorescent, tungsten, or auto – see which one looks better.

I used auto focus to get image in focus (on a brightly lit part of pier about % to 2/3 way down) and then switched camera/lens to manual focus, so as focus would not shift when I recomposed the image.

I used "in camera" spot metering to get an idea of what my exposure should be and then switched the camera to manual exposure (manually setting time and f stop) and did not worry what the in camera exposure meter indicated, as there was a lot of darkness in the scene away from the pier.

Start with a 10 second exposure at f5.6 – f8 and see what result is like. The shorter the exposure the more defined are the colour sections (a longer exposure means some colours in the light show merge in the recorded image). All my shots were between 8 and 15 seconds, and this blurs the waves nicely!




Canon 1D MkIII, fluorescent white balance, ISO200, 24mm, 13 sec @ f8

### **Book Review**

John Stewart LPSNZ

If you want to improve your landscape photography then get a copy of a new book by Queenstown photographers Mike Langford and Jackie Ranken – Creative Landscape Photography.



Together they run photography courses at Queenstown Centre for Creative Photography and have produced this 110 page spiral bound booklet showing the settings they used for many of their award winning photographs.

There are many double page spreads (as per below) showing an image and the settings used to create it in camera. While both Mike and Jackie use Canon 5D MkII cameras (full-frame digital SLR) the camera menu shots should be self-explanatory and easily adapted to other models and makes

For example a snow scene (Dead Daisies) advises to use +1.3 exposure compensation so the snow does not come out neutral grey, plus use monochrome picture style. There are also a few images in the nature genre in the book.
