### 2011 Southern Regional - Dunedin

The Southern Regional in Dunedin was attended by over 100 photographers from all over the South island, and some from further afield. 37 people from Christchurch attended.

The Convention was held at the new Forsyth Barr Stadium, which dwarfed surrounding buildings. Mayor Dave Cull welcomed us on the 4<sup>th</sup> floor of the stadium where we were able to look down on an immaculate chequer board grass field.

The guest speakers were introduced and a selection of their images shown. A delicious dinner followed served with almost military style precision.

Graham Dainty was the first speaker the following morning. He spoke of his love of fine landscapes, plus motor sports, and nature. He was followed by Craig McKenzie who was just as enthusiastic and passionate about wildlife. Both speakers showed fine examples of their work. Lunch followed after which everyone went on their respective field trips.

My choice was the Victory Beach field trip to photograph sea lions. After a hearty walk to our destination we found the tide was coming in and would probably not see any. This was soon rectified as we were taken to another beach where we saw a huge sleeping sea lion. We went on to Tairoa Heads where we saw Northern Royal Albatrosses, Gulls, spotted Shags, Oyster Catchers, and rabbits.

Sunday morning the speaker was Jane Trotter. She talked about and showed us her abstract images, she certainly is creative.

We were then shown some AVs which were very clever. The audience went quiet when the Christchurch  $22^{nd}$  September Black & White shots were shown. It was the only time I thought of earthquakes – thank goodness. Lunch followed and farewells to old and new friends.

After the Conference some of our New Brighton folk went to the magical "Butterfly House" at the museum. I was delightfully amazed at the whole room complete with tropical plants and a waterfall. There were plates of pineapple and melon for the butterflies which allowed photographers to get close up shots.

After a cup of coffee and chat at the museum café we went on our separate ways home.

### **Brett de Thier**

Brett de Their, graphic designer and photographer

He was our guest speaker in November and gave a very entertaining talk on his books, State Highway One New Zealand, and State Highway One Australia

The 1st book, State Highway One New Zealand came about totally unplanned. Over a period of 4 years Brett had taken many images of places he had seen from his travels up and down the country, most of them along State Highway One. The book is a collection of these images. The NZ book was produced 12 years ago and led to State Highway One Australia.

Brett designed and published the book himself, with New Zealand sponsors. The book was printed in China. Some of the images were done with an old Nikon on transparency film. Brett found China wonderful to deal with.

The Australian version of their State Highway One was planned. Brett spent 3 months travelling around the perimeter of Australia. He started in Sydney in 2003 in a Kea Serenta 4wd a friend lent him. He found the stretch from Cairns to Darwin the most interesting. The highway across there consisted mainly of a 2 wheel track.

All the images were shot on film, he had a small chilli bin in the car to keep the films cold as there were no photo labs across the top of Australia.

During his trip around Australia there was no rain at all and he had to use an umbrella

He used 50 rolls of 35mm film, out of a total of 100 rolls. He had to discipline himself and had to ask with each shot whether that shot would be suitable for the book.

Brett kept a little notebook and made a thumbnail sketch of every shot and notes of where it was taken. One of the photos he took of a pump on the Nulabor Plain has since been used in an Australian magazine.

Again he did the design for the Australian book himself, the scanning was done in Auckland and it was sent to China to print.

Brett considers there are only two things that make a good photo, that is where you stand, and when you push the button.


